





21st Combined AGRESCO of SAUs

The 21st Combined Meeting of Agricultural Research Council (AGRESCO) of SAU's was held at different venues of AAU, JAU, NAU and SDAU hosted by Sardarkrushinagar Dantiwada Agricultural University, Sardarkrushinagar during May 05-27, 2025. Hon'ble Vice Chancellors of JAU, AAU, NAU and SDAU namely Dr. V. P. Chovatia, Dr. K. B. Kathiria, Dr. Z. P. Patel and Dr. R. M. Chauhan, respectively were remained present during the meeting.



During the meeting, JAU has released six new crop varieties viz., Pigeon Pea (GT 112: Sorath Bhuri), Brinjal (GLB-11: Sorath Priya), Bottle Gourd (GBG-2: Sorath Nidhi), Pearl Millet (GHB 1305: Sorath Maru Shakti), Sesame (G. Til 21: Sorath Kalapi) and Soybean (G. Soy 5: Sorath Leela) in the state. Besides, 38 technologies /recommendations were made for farmers and 22 recommendations were made for scientific community. In addition, as many as 65 new technical programs were formulated to combat the applied and basic problems of agriculture and allied fields.

Crop Varieties Released

1. Pigeon Pea: Gujarat Tur 112 (GT 112: Sorath Bhuri):

Farmers of Gujarat state growing pigeon pea are recommended to grow dark red colour medium maturing (176 days) variety Gujarat Tur 112 (GT 112: Sorath Bhuri). It has recorded 2245 kg/ha average seed yield, which was higher (8.60-24.40) over check varieties. Seeds of this variety are of very large size (11.10 g/100 seeds). This variety found moderately resistant against wilt and sterility mosaic diseases with low pod borer damage.





2. Brinjal: Gujarat Long Brinjal-11 (GLB-11: Sorath Priya)


The farmers of Gujarat state growing the brinjal crop during late *kharif /rabi* season are recommended to grow brinjal variety Gujarat Long Brinjal- 11 (GLB-11: Sorath Priya). The variety has recorded a mean fruit yield of 440 q/ha, which was higher (12.0-20.8%) over check varieties. The fruits of GLB-11 are medium in size with a medium long shape and pinkish in colour with good shining. This variety was found comparable against little leaf disease while, whitefly population was found low as compared to check varieties.





3. Bottle Gourd: Gujarat Bottle Gourd-2 (GBG- 2: Sorath Nidhi)

The farmers of Gujarat state growing bottle gourd during *kharif* season are recommended to grow bottle gourd variety Gujarat Bottle Gourd-2 (GBG-2: Sorath Nidhi). The variety has recorded the mean fruit yield of 261 q/ha, which was 18.6 and 29.4 per cent higher over check varieties. The fruits of GBG-2 are medium long and elongated curved with flat shape of apex at peduncle end and attractive light greenish in colour. This variety was found moderately resistant to moderately susceptible against mosaic, resistant to moderately resistant against downy mildew disease and resistant to immune against powdery mildew disease.





4. Pearl Millet: Gujarat Hybrid Bajra 1305 (GHB 1305: Sorath Maru Shakti)





The *kharif* pearl millet growing farmers of Gujarat state are recommended to grow early maturing biofortified (high Fe and Zn content) hybrid GHB 1305 (Sorath Maru Shakti). This hybrid recorded average 2472 kg/ha grain and 6203 kg/ha dry fodder yield which was 14.6 and 29.30 per cent higher than check hybrid, respectively. This hybrid found resistant against major pearl millet diseases like downy mildew, blast and rust and tolerant to resistant for pest like shoot fly, stem borer and *Helicoverpa* larvae.

5. Sesame: Gujarat Til 21 (G. Til 21: Sorath Kalapi)


The farmers of Gujarat state growing sesame in *summer* season are recommended to grow Gujarat Til 21 (G.Til 21: Sorath Kalapi). This variety recorded seed yield of 1593 kg/ha which was 17.5-22.3 per cent higher over the check varieties. Seeds of this variety are white and bold; and it recorded 47.37 % oil content. This variety showed lower incidence of stem and root rot, phyllody disease and thrips.





6. Soybean: Gujarat Soybean 5 (G. Soy 5: Sorath Leela)

The farmers of Gujarat state growing soybean during *kharif* season are recommended to grow early maturing variety Gujarat Soybean 5 (G. Soy 5: Sorath Leela). This variety matures in 90 days and recorded mean seed yield of 2294 kg/ha, which was 20.5 per cent higher over the check variety. This variety recorded 19.9 per cent higher oil and 17.1 per cent higher protein over the check variety. This variety showed lower incidence of *Rhizoctonia* root rot and *Phytophthora* diseases as well as *Spodoptera* and thrips infestation as compared to check varieties.





Varsha Vigyan Parisamvad-2025

"The 31st Varsha Vigyan Parisamvad–2025" was jointly organized by Varsha Vigyan Mandal-Junagadh and JAU on May 17, 2025 at Junagadh. The Parisamvad was inaugurated under the chairmanship of Shri Raghavjibhai Patel, Hon'ble Minister of Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Cow-Breeding, Fisheries, Rural Housing and Rural Development, Govt. of Gujarat. On this occasion, Dr. V. P. Chovatia, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, JAU, Dr. A.R. Pathak, Former Vice Chancellor, JAU, Dr. N. B. Jadav, President of Varsha Vigyan Mandal remained present and shared their valuable guidance, insights, and inspiring words with the audience on this special occasion. A large number of forecasters from various regions, along with enthusiastic and interested farmers, actively participated in the symposium. A total of 51 forecasters presented their predictions during the event.



Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan

The "Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan" campaign was conducted during the pre-*Kharif* season from May 29 to June 12, 2025, across all States with the objective of creating widespread awareness among farmers. The campaign focused on modern production practices for major *Kharif* crops, dissemination of information on government schemes and policies, promotion of soil health cards and balanced fertilizer use, encouragement of judicious chemical application, and collection of feedback on grassroots-level innovations.



Teams comprising Senior Scientists, Heads of Departments, KVK and University Scientists, ATMA personnel, and line department officials actively participated in this initiative.

Special emphasis was laid on natural farming, introduction of new crops and improved varieties, and adoption of advanced production technologies. These messages were communicated through *Gosthis*, group discussions, *Krishi Sabhas*, and expert lectures. Farmers were also sensitized about various government schemes and encouraged to use online mobile applications such as JAU iKrushi Sanhita and Krushi Pragati.



The *Krishi Sabhas* organized during the campaign witnessed enthusiastic participation from farmers and included the distribution of seeds, soil health cards, and other informative materials. A dedicated Krishi Rath Yatra further enhanced outreach. Under this campaign, all KVKs of JAU organized a series of impactful events as outlined below.

KVK Targhadia inaugurated Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan on May 29, 2025 in presence of Shri Raghavjibhai Patel, Hon'ble Agricultural Minister, Gujarat, Shri Rambhai Mokariya, Rajya Sabha M.P., Dr. V. P. Chovatia, Ho'ble Vice Chancellor, JAU and other JAU Authorities and Scientists. The Abhiyan covered 84 villages of four Taluka (Rajkot, Paddadhari, Jasdan, Vinchiya) of Rajkot district with total 4286 farmers and farm women participation.



Two teams from KVK, Amreli, actively participated in this initiative and provided information on modern farming techniques for Kharif crops in a total of 45 villages, benefiting about 16,700 farmers. A total of 2,740 farmers from 30 villages of Morbi district participated in this programme through KVK, Morbi. KVK, Khapat (Porbandar), covered 69 villages, benefiting 9,194 farmers.

KVK, Surendranagar, covered over 90 villages across 10 blocks, benefiting more than 18,549 farmers through expert guidance. KVK, Jamnagar, actively celebrated the campaign in both Jamnagar and Devbhoomi Dwarka districts. Two teams of scientists

from JAU, along with officers from various line departments, traversed 90 villages through a Krishi Rath Yatra, with around 3,942 farmers attending the events, thereby contributing to the success of the Bharat Krishi Jagran Yatra.



KVK, Pipaliya (Rajkot-II), conducted Krishi Goshthi's in 45 different villages of Dhoraji, Upleta, Jetpur, Gondal, Jamkandorna, and Kotda Sangani blocks, benefiting a total of 9,806 farmers, including women farmers, through the campaign.

Overall, a total of 698 programmes were organized, benefiting more than 91,000 farmers across nine districts of Saurashtra.



Diploma Certificate Distribution Programme

A Diploma Certificate Distribution Ceremony was held on June 26, 2025, at College of Horticulture, JAU, Junagadh, to award diploma certificates to the polytechnic students of JAU. Training-cum-Demonstration Programme for Farmers and Farm Women

The AICRP on Plastic Engineering in Agriculture Structural and Environmental Management (PEASEM), Department of Renewable Energy Engineering, CAET, JAU, Junagadh, organized two Training-cum-Demonstration Programmes for farmers and farm women at Khamdhrol and Maliya Hatina villages of Junagadh district on April 24 and May 22, respectively. Dr. P. S. Jayswal and Dr. S. P. Cholera delivered expert lectures, covering the importance of mulching, the benefits of net house cultivation, and the use of plastic in crop processing. Practical demonstrations of innovative technologies, such as nursery net houses and solar tunnel dryers, were also organized. The programmes saw active participation from 65 farmers in Khamdhrol and 36 progressive farmers and farm women in Maliya Hatina.



NPK Liquid Consortia Bio-Fertilizer Launching

The Department of Plant Pathology, CoA, JAU, Junagadh, launched an NPK Liquid Consortia Bio-Fertilizer under the brand name 'Gir Sawaj Bio NPK Culture' in the august presence of Dr. V. P. Chovatia, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, JAU. Dr. A. G. Pansuriya, Director of Research, JAU; Dr. V. D. Tarapara, Associate Director of Research, JAU; Dr. K. K. Kanzaria, Professor and Head of the Department; and Dr. S. V. Lathiya, Assistant Research Scientist, were also present during the launch. The product is specially formulated for the farming community and is designed to fix atmospheric nitrogen, solubilize complex forms of phosphorus, and mobilize potash in the soil. This formulation is expected to significantly improve nutrient availability and enhance crop productivity.


Preparatory classes and mock Test for NET/SRF Aspirants


