Rule-6.0	Central Admission Committee
	As per the powers conferred on State Council under Section 25(7)(g) of the
	Gujarat Agricultural Universities Act-2004, Council of State Agricultural
	Universities constituted a Committee called "Central Admission Committee
	for Under graduate Courses to regulate the admission of candidates to
	all degree courses.
